




Fuel and fire in northern Mozambique

This comic is dedicated to the people of northern Mozambique whose lives have been torn apart and disregarded by corporations and governments.

In 2010, a large quantity of gas is discovered off the coast of northern Mozambique (Cabo Delgado Province) ...








The gas projects have fuelled violent insurgencies in the region.



Insurgencies are fuelled by poverty: the local population in the north of Mozambique have been excluded by the state from the benefits of the gas windfall.

Unemployment and frustration is especially high among younger people.






And now the majority of the population have lost their livelihoods,



all while watching the elite get richer





Extremist armed groups have launched aggressive attacks on civilians in the northern province of Cabo Delgado.

Since 2020, increased violations against civilians, including killings, beheadings, sexual assault and kidnappings, have been reported in Cabo Delgado.

Insurgents have been abducting women and girls, to use them as wives and concubines.



These women and girls are also forced into recruiting and spying for the insurgents.



If they are captured in order to force them to confess, they are likely to suffer more violence, extortion and sexual assault at the hands of government forces.






Due to the insurgencies many people have fled their houses and villages.




People live in refugee camps under poor conditions. It is a humanitarian crisis.



The refugee camps are overcrowded, there's no privacy. They're primitive, lacking decent water and sanitation.





In 2021, around 1.3 million people from Cabo Delgado need humanitarian assistance and protection.

In Palma in March 2021, militants killed dozens of people including foreign workers working on the nearby gas projects. In April 2021, TotalEnergies claimed 'force majeure' over the violence and paused the project. Because of that, the compensation payments to local people stopped completely, leaving them to survive on humanitarian aid in the wake of a full blown insurgency.

Mozambique is already vulnerable to climate disasters like cyclones, floods and droughts.

The gas extraction projects in Mozambique have the potential to result into an enormous release of greenhouse gas emissions, especially methane, which could increase the whole of Mozambique's greenhouse gas emissions by 14%. This would exacerbate the climate crisis.


## Gas extraction projects in northern Mozambique: climate crisis and environmental impact

Gas is often presented as a 'green' fossil fuel. This is not the case. The development of gas projects in northern Mozambique will have a huge impact on the local environment in Cabo Delgado.
